

Speaker's Biography



Fritz Sager is Professor of Political Science at and member of the Executive Board of the Center of Competence for Public Management at the University of Bern and Vice-Dean of the University's Faculty of Business, Economics, and Social Sciences. He is specialized in administrative studies and theory, policy research and evaluation, organizational analysis, and Swiss politics. His research has been published in the *Public Administration Review*, *Governance*, *Public Administration*, *Policy & Politics*, *Political Studies*, *West European Politics*, the *Journal of Urban Affairs*, the *American Journal of Evaluation*, *Public Management Review*, *Public Money & Management*, *Evaluation*, and the *Swiss Political Science Review* among others.

Sager won the *Marshall E. Dimock Award* for the best lead article in the *Public Administration Review* during the volume year 2009, the *Highly Commended Paper Award* at the Literati Network Awards for Excellence in 2013 and the **Prix SEVAL 2015** awarded by the Swiss Evaluation Society.

He currently directs a number of research projects on various subjects such as the utilization of evaluations in direct democratic campaigns, the politics of blame avoidance in policy failures, the comparative evaluation of complex program structures in tobacco prevention, the acceptance of new policy instruments in land-use planning and the locational policies of secondary capital cities.
