- Its not (just) about the money
- Some things aren't as simple as they look
- The media is not (just) a mirror of society
- The UN can be very effective!

Tax collection in Pakistan

- We know incentives work
- But what kinds of incentives?
- Performance based honoraria
- Supervision
- End year bonus

Tax collection up by 12% points





What did we learn?

- Performance pay worked to increase tax collection
 - Simple was better
 - Citizen satisfaction was key
- Social recognition
- Simple nudges




Does protection work?

- *Naively* protection has a large effect on preventing deforestation (600%)
- After you account for programme placement, there is <u>no additional</u> effect.


 Very important to account for inherent programme placement bias when assessing the effectiveness of programmes.

Effectiveness of public programmes in India

- India's NREGA programme:
- Largest employment guarantee scheme.
- Very low uptake.







What worked?

- NREGA disbursement expenditures <u>dropped</u> by 25%
- But wages and beneficiaries remained the same!
- Delayed payments
- 'Ghost beneficiaries' disappeared!

E-payments being advocated in public expenditure programmes across the country.

Checking our assumptions about what works helps


Assessing the direction *and* magnitude of <u>bias</u> helps.



4. THE UN CAN BE VERY EFFECTIVE!

Alternative dispute resolution (ADR) in Liberia





Reduced land disputes by 28% Reduced dependence on formal courts by 24%









Policy Implication

Behavioral and institutional change feasible with broad education and training campaigns



We learnt

- Its not just about the money. Constructing performance pays, nudges and social recognition can be very effective.
- Media can be very effective in changing attitudes (and not just elections)
- Some UN resolution mechanisms if designed well can be effective.
- Implementation is key: e-systems can reduce a lot of leakages (by 20%) but account for unintended consequences.
